Plot and Characters

The plot is the same as Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, but this time Theseus looks like Dick Clark and the palace is the set of a hit TV "bandstand show." The young lovers Hermia and Lysander decide to run off into the woods to escape Hermia's dad, Egeus, and his wrath. Egeus is the sponsor of
